

Antibiotic Amnesty Campaign 2023

We're taking part this year.

Find out how you can help too.



The veterinary profession is coming together again this November to hold an Antibiotic Amnesty. The aim is to encourage clients to return any unused or out of date antibiotics. This will allow correct and safe disposal of the antibiotic medications, which will avoid contamination of the environment and help prevent antimicrobial resistance due to inappropriate disposal.

Antibiotics are essential to treat many conditions in both humans and animals. But they must be used carefully, to ensure they are effective when patients really need them.

If not used responsibly, antibiotics lead to dangerous side effects, delay an accurate diagnosis, and contribute to antimicrobial resistance (AMR). Inappropriate disposal of unused antibiotics also damages the environment, impacting water quality and wildlife.

Antimicrobial resistance is one of the biggest global health issues of our time. We must act, together.

Please return your unused medications to a vet at your visit or to the reception team at the surgery.

Payment link

You may have been asked to pay via "an online payment link" recently. This link (Nordhealth) connects directly with our practice management system, providing a secure and accurate method of processing your payments.

If you wish to take advantage of the 5% discount for payment at the time of treatment please let us know. Payment must be made within 24 hours of the visit.

Keeping an eye open!

Remember the importance of monitoring your horse's eyes and getting a veterinary examination if the eye is swollen painful or cloudy. Rapid treatment can mean a quick resolution and prevent potentially sight threatening complications.

This horse presented with a painful eye, there was some eyelid swelling and the horse was holding the eye partially closed.



The cornea had

been damaged and an ulcer was present. The cornea is the most superficial layer of the eye. Fluorescein stain was used to diagnosis this with a positive stain indicating there is a defect/ulcer. You can see this as a focal area of bright green. Topical antibiotic eyedrops were used to control the infection. Anti-inflammatory medications were used to keep the horse comfortable. Treatment was initiated promptly resulting in the eye being completely healed in 7 days.

Don't forget to look after your old friend this autumn and release their inner youth!
